




This 2011 edition of "Panthers Forever" is presented to you with the hope that it may serve as a source of fond memories for you.

A Giant Among Men



Dr. Benjamin Elijah Mays (1894 - 1984) was one of the most prominent educators, social reformists and civil rights and religious leaders of his time. Dr. Mays' struggled for dignity respect and integrity, while simultaneously touching upon the collective struggle of African-Americans. Dr. Mays was a pioneer in social reform and civil rights, was the President of Morehouise College from 1940 - 1967, was a mentor to Dr. Martin Luthe King, Jr. and held the honor of being the "First" to hold several important and powerful positions in private and public organizations. He was a giant among men.

Dr. Benjamin E. Mays Historical Preservation Site

In memory of Dr. Benjamin E. Mays, a historical preservation site was developed and preserved in Uptown Greenwood, SC. This enormous undertaking that took approximately four years to complete was accomplished under the leadership of Dr. Joseph D. Patton, CEO, and Mr. Loy Sartin, Curator GLEAMNS (Greenwood-Lexington, Edgefield-Anderson-McCormick-Newberry-Saluda Counties) Human Resources Commission, Inc. Dr. Benjamin E. Mays' birth home was moved from its original location in Epworth, SC in Southeast Greenwood County in 2004 to the new location. A faux barn that was constructed next to his birth home is modern inside and serves as the Benjamin E. Mays Interpretive Center/Museum. The third building on site is the Burns Springs School, an original one-room African American School from Dr. Mays' neighborhood,

His birth home, the yard and school have been amazingly preserved and arc readily reminiscent of a tenant farmer's homestead. Inside the museum, there is a large collection of photographs, artifacts, memorabilia, and books written by Dr. Mays. In the museum's theater (seats 46), there is a large screen wall-mounted TV with a DVD player that is used to show films about Dr. Mays' life and to play some of his speeches on CD.

Upon completion of the preservation site, GLEAMS put together a program that was held on April 26, 2011 at 1:00 pm. Invited to the ceremony were various dignitaries and friends of Dr. Mays. An invitation was extended also to former students, faculty, staff and friends of the Benjamin E. Mays Consolidated School, Pacolet Mills, SC, the first school to be named in Dr. Mays' honor.

A group, comprised of 21 individuals from Spartanburg County, attended the site dedication service. On program were Ambassador Andrew Young of Atlanta as the keynote speaker; Dr. Robert Franklin, president, Morehouse College, Atlanta, GA; Dr. Elaine Tuttle Hansen, President, Bates College, Lewiston, ME (Dr. Mays' Legacy at Bates College; Dr. Johnnie McFadden, Professor, Benjamin E. Mays Academy at USC, Columbia, SC (Dr. Mays' Legacy at University of South Carolina; Dr. Daniel Ball, President, Lander University, Greenwood, SC (Dr. Mays' Association with Lander University); Rev. Danny Webb, Pastor, Old Mt. Zion Baptist Church, Epworth, SC (Dr. Mays' Home Church); Dr. Uzce Brown and members of the Morehouse Glee Club, Atlanta, GA; Mrs. Billye Aaron, wife of baseball hall of famer Mr. Henry "Hank" Aaron who were friends of Dr. Mays; letters from President Barrack O'Bama, Former President Jimmy Carter, and The Honorable James E. Clyburn were read by Dr. Larry Jackson, President Emeritus, Lander University, Greenwood, SC, and members of Dr. Mays' family were introduced.

On the evening of April 26th at 6:30 PM, we attended the recently produced documentary on Dr. Mays' life, *Change in the Wind* at the Greenwood Community Theater. What an amazing day of love recognition that was shown posthumously in memory and honor of Dr. Benjamin E. Mays, the greatest educator of the 20th century and the distinguished gentleman from Epworth, SC.



After the inception of mandatory integration in 1970, class reunions were promoted and continued to be held under the name of Benjamin E. Mays. The name that meant as much to us as Martin Luther King, Jr., Malcolmn X, Fredrick Douglass, Harriet Tubman and Barrack O'Bama, to name a few. The love for the man and the school was running rampant. And although the name was removed from the building, uniforms, and letterhead, the endearing respect for the school and the exceptional, distinguished southern gentleman from Epworth, SC in Greenwood County has been ever present among the former students, faculty and friends of Benjamin E. Mays.

The class reunions continued to be sponsored by various classes from the time period of 1954 through 1970. History of the

Benjamin E. Mays Consolidated School Pacolet Mills, South Carolina

August 1953 - May 1970

The Benjamin E. Mays Consolidated School was built to further educational opportunities for the Black African-American students in Spartanburg School District Three. Mays was unique in that it provided academic courses of study for elementary, middle and high school students at the same location. The school provided a curriculum in grades 9 through 12 that prepared its students for a GPA entry into most colleges and universities across the country.

The building to house Mays students was completed and opened in August of 1953 with over 400 students in grades 1 through 12. Principal Edward West Brown transferred from Ralph J. Bunche Elementary School in Cowpens, SC to become the first principal of the new school. Teachers transferring from Ralph J. Bunche were Mrs. Jessie M. Hackett and Miss Helen Porter, while those from the Marysville Elementary School in Pacolet Mills were Mrs. Alberta Ruff Daniel and Mrs. Sylvia Evans. Mrs. Ernestine Lyles, Mrs. Sarah Littlejohn, Mrs. Lessie High and Mrs. Sarah Sanders came from the Zion Hill Elementary School in Central Pacolet.

The newly constructed education facility in Pacolet Mills opened without a name. The faculty and student body were given the honor of naming the new school. As suggested by Mrs. Jessie Hackett and Ms. Susie Ellis, the school was honored with the name of the distinguished southern gentleman from Greenwood SC, Dr. Benjamin Elijah Mays, the 27 year president of Morehouse College in Atlanta, GA. It was the first of six education buildings that were named in his honor.

Dr. Benjamin E. Mays was the keynote speaker at the dedicatory services and delivered the baccalaureate sermon to the first graduating class at the school in May, 1954. He stayed an extra day to meet with the student body and faculty. This became an annual affair in 1956 with his wife Mrs. Sadie Gray Mays accompanying him. Dr. Mays provided scholarships for the young college bound men who were interested in attending Morehouse College. Mays High School had nine young men to become graduates of Morehouse College. The late Eddie D. Gaffney (class of '66) was employed as Dean of Student Affairs and Uzee Brown (68') is currently Professor and Chairperson of the Music Department at the college. Mays yielded graduates who excelled as doctors, lawyers, teachers, computer analyst/programmers, nurses, businessmen and women at the executive level, and other positions in healthcare, business, education, psychology, sociology, etc.

B.E. Mays Consolidated School was special because of the rapport that parents, teachers and students established as a very close-knit organization. Its focus was primarily on a curriculum of teaching and academic excellence along with sound and appropriate disciplinary practices.

Mays students were eager, conscientious, and lost little time in organizing championship male and female "Panthers" basketball teams, a Glee Club, National Honor Society, Drama Club, a Yearbook staff, 4-H Club, Future Farmers of America and many other sports and academic activities.

Mr. Brown held the position of principal of Mays Consolidated School until 1961 and succeeding him was Mr. John D. Blanding, the agriculture teacher. Two years later, Mr. William LeRoy Myers accepted the principalship and remained in that position until the school closed in 1970 at the inception of mandatory integration. Mrs. Alberta Daniels served as assistant principal of the elementary department until 1964. Mr. Alexander B. Brockman then became the assistant principal of the elementary curriculum until its closing, as the mandate for the nationwide integration was implemented.

As enforced integration was ushered in, the name - Benjamin E. Mays Consolidated School was removed from the building. However, the name Benjamin E. Mays remained indelibly true and dear in the hearts and minds of the students, faculty, parents, and friends of the school. During the mid-70's a group of Mays students appeared before James Buie, superintendent for Spartanburg County School District Three and the school board in an attempt to restore Dr. Mays' name officially to the school. The group, spearheaded by Eddie D. Oglesby ('58) deceased and Lester Johnson ('58) deceased, also included Clifford "Buck" Smith, Jr. ('60) deceased; Boncile Dover Whittenburg ('62) and Julius Smith ('71).

Nearly three decades had passed since the national mandate for total integration of schools was issued. However, restoration officially of the name "Benjamin E. Mays Consolidated School" at the school continued to be an issue with many of those who attended, were employed by or affiliated with the school. In 1998 Vivian Smith Teamer ('64) was instrumental in organizing the B.E. Mays Renaming Committee that consisted of Coy Smith Mobley ('54); Boncile Dover Whittenburg ('62); Louise Maybin Woodruff ('62); Minnie Johnson McCollum ('65); Joseph8ine Reed McBeth ('58); Julius Smith ('71); John Dickey ('50); Betty Wannamaker Lokuji ('70); Lester Johnson, Sr.('58) deceased; Clifford "Buck" Smith ('60) deceased, and Pansy Hardy Byrd ('55) deceased.

The committee was formed to pursue again the idea of having the name of the school, letterhead, uniforms, etc., restored at Mays. At the recommendation of Dr. James O. Ray, superintendent, and approval by the school board, the name "Original Benjamin E. Mays Consolidated School" was restored honorarily to the building along with renovations that were made in 1999. The name was unveiled by Clifford Smith as part of the dedication service that was held in November, 1999. In addition, the B.E. Mays Renaming Committee provided, as part of the ceremony, plaques that contained the names of all the students that attended Mays Consolidated School, faculty, administration, superintendent and school board members. A portrait of Dr. Mays painted by Mr. Raymond Floyd of Spartanburg was also unveiled. The portrait, a tribute to the school by Boncile Dover Whittenburg and the plaques hang in the building today.

As stated earlier, Dr. Mays' name was restored onto the school from an honorary standpoint and the school has operated as an integrated middle school since August, 1970. The name restored to the building, along with the portrait of Dr. Mays, the tribute and the plaques continue to serve as a reminder and provide physical evidence of the School's original mission under the name of Benjamin E. Mays Consolidated School.

Academic achievement for the underserved Black African American students in the community, as well as the high expulsion rate, at all education levels became a concern for many. Coupled with a prevailing interest in the restoration of Dr. Mays' name and legacy at the school, the B.E. Mays Alumni Association evolved under the leadership of Vivian Smith Teamer ('64) as president. In addition to the president, Boncile Dover Whittenburg ('62) and Minnie Johnson McCollum ('65) were charter members. The board consisted of Willie Gist ('63) deceased; Pearl Smith Black ('64); Floyd Black ('64); Gary Lewis ('63); Tommie Hardy Goode ('65); Yvonne Smith McBride ('65); Louvenia Johnson Porter ('64); Brenda Smith ('64); Louise Maybin Williams ('62); Mamie Johnson Gilree ('61); and Douglas Gist ('61); deceased. Under the umbrella of the organization, it was soon realized that many and varied issues could be addressed. The B.E, Mays Alumni received certification from the State of South Carolina as a nonprofit organization in March, 2000 and received its 501(c)(3) tax exempt status July, 2004.

The mission of the B.E. Mays Alumni was to help provide financial assistance and other measures necessary to promote educational standards of excellence for the students. As a result, the Benjamin E. Mays After School Tutorial program surfaced to provide individualized tutoring, in particular, to the underserved elementary and middle school students in the school district. Nevertheless, the program was open to any student requiring one-one-one tutoring,

Rooms in various libraries in Spartanburg County were utilized for the initial tutorial sessions. In an attempt to centralize the location of the tutoring sessions, the Alumni Association was able to move the tutorial sessions from a room in various libraries to Pacolet Recreation Center and A Child's Daycare Center in Pacolet, SC. The Mays Alumni gained approval from Dr. James O. Ray, superintendent to provide tutorial sessions at the Middle School of Pacolet (a.k.a. Original Benjamin E. Mays Consolidated School) to complement the Extended Day Program at the school that provided group tutoring sessions. It was recognized that certain students were more receptive to participating in a tutorial program that offered individualized tutoring sessions.

The Mays After School Tutorial Program reimbursed college students for their mileage. It also provided a report of the tutoring hours that were converted into community service credit hours at the respective college or university at the end of each session. At the Annual Benjamin E. Mays Memorial Banquet in March, each tutor was given a stipend payment for providing excellent tutorial services.

In addition, an event, "Benjamin E. Mays Day" was implemented in 2005 at the Middle School of Pacolet (Originally Benjamin E. Mays Consolidated School) by the assistant principal, Charlie J. Eaddy. At the first event, that has become an annual observance, Dr. Horace Richard Rice ('60) presented a copy of his book entitled, "The Buffalo Ridge Cherokee" to the school that was received by principal, Cynthia James and assistant principal, Charlie Eaddy. Dr. Rice was also the guest speaker at this observance that is held each year on the last Friday in March. At the 6th Annual 2011 Benjamin E. Mays Day, former teacher, Orangelow Miller Ruff was the guest speaker. An essay contest was also held to help in motivating the students to learn about the person whose name was included in the renovations to the Middle School of Pacolet in 1999. Dr. Mays is considered the greatest educator of the 20th Century.

Although Dr. Mays' name has not been restored officially to the school, what is even more important is the fact that individuals have been moved and motivated to help in the educating of our young people that is so desperately needed despite the varied challenges. And because of the contributions that Dr. Mays made in the field of education, not just on a local, state or national basis but internationally as well, his legacy still lives on in our hearts and minds.

In conclusion, a clipping from the 1945 spring issue of the "Morehouse College Bulletin" is cited in which president Benjamin E. Mays stated that the school's educational aims were, "To improve the quality and quantity of our work to the end that our graduates will improve the quality of their leadership in their respective communities. We should strive to produce men superior in poise, social imagination, integrity, resourcefulness, and superior in possessing an all-embracing love for all peoples irrespective of race or color." It is, therefore, our aim to assume a supportive role individually and collectively when feasible in modeling the aims of Dr. Benjamin E. Mays, the distinguished southern gentleman from Epworth, South Carolina in Greenwood County. We certainly have had a 'jewel' among us.
