Woman Who Saw Pacolet Flood Dies

Mrs. Mary Ernest Massey, 92, of 486 Gentry Street, who watched four of her children drown in the June 6, 1903, flood which swept through cotton mills and homes along Pacolet River, died at a Spartanburg hospital Thursday.

Mrs. Massey died at 7 a.m. from injuries sustained in a fall at her home Wednesday.

Members of the family said she fell beside her bed after walking from the living room to her bedroom. She complained of dizziness and attending physicians said she suffered a stroke or heart attack.

Mrs. Massey broke her hip in the fall. She had recovered from a broken hip about four years ago.

Mrs. Massey frequently talked about the 1903 flood which claimed the lives of four of her children when Clifton Mills and the mill village was heavily damaged.

She often recalled that water forced her and the children to the second floor of the house. Then when it became apparent the house was going down before the swirling, muddy waters, Mrs. Massey climbed out a window into a tree top, holding two small children.

The tree toppled and the two children were swept away. Two other children also drowned.

Mrs. Massey was born reared in Burke County, N. C., and was a daughter of the late and Limie Hampton Grastie She was a former resi-Ernest. dent of Duncan but for the past three years had made her home with her daughter, Mrs. R. A. of Spartanburg. Arrowood was a member of the First Baptist Church at Duncan and the TEL Class.

Surviving in addition to Mrs. Arrowood are: 10 grandchildren, 16 great-grandchildren and five great-great grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted at 4 p.m. today at the First Baptist Church in Duncan by Dr. D. Phillip Martin and the Rev. Dewey Welchel. Burial will be in Wood Memorial Park.

Pallbearers will be: Bobby and Jimmy Allen, Ed Eustin, Walter Minton, Ralph Woodward and Billy Alexander. Members of the TEL Class of the church will be honorary pallbearers.
